Compliance Gate Platform: Monthly Review Methodology (GB+NI)

We review official web page sources each month to determine if we need to make changes to the compliance requirements list entries and/or the templates.

The review is limited to the items listed in the tables, and we do not keep track of news/updates announced elsewhere (e.g. not announced in the linked pages).

Further, we only cover and track updates related to the listed items (see tables). Regulations, directives, or standards not mentioned in this document are **not covered** by the platform, or monitored.



Step 1: Compliance Requirements Lists

- **1.1:** We track the items listed below by:
- a. Opening the source links
- b. Check if there is a new version published in the last calendar month.

Example



c. We normally report the corresponding Textual Amendment.

Note: This process is only applied to monitor amendments to regulations already covered by the Compliance Requirements List database. It is not able to identify new regulations.

Not monitored: Some regulations, standards, and requirements included in the compliance requirements lists are not actively monitored or updated.

Decision-making process

We decide whether or not to update a CRL entry based on the following:



- **2.1:** For each template, we compare the document template items (database) to the relevant part/article/annex of the latest version of the source text that it is based on.
- **2.2:** If there is an update in the source text, we update the document template according to the latest source version.

Step 3: Other monitored sources

3.1: We monitor the News from agencies that are relevant to **some** of the regulations that we cover in order to find relevant news that may not be published on www.legislation.gov.uk. We may report the following:

A	New regulations that we deem relevant to the product categories that we cover
В	Guidance documents that we deem relevant to the product categories that we cover
С	Updates concerning standards that are relevant to the product categories that we cover

- **3.2:** If we find news that we deem relevant, we report it on the Monthly Report.
- a. Additionally, if the news concerns updates on the regulations listed above, we will evaluate if we need to update the corresponding entries in the compliance requirements list.
- b. Finally, if we find a new regulation that is relevant to the product categories that we cover, we will evaluate if we need to add it to the compliance requirements list.

Step 4: Compliance Gate Platform testing

Compliance Requirements List

The purpose of this test is to verify if all selected entries (country, product categories, and specifications) appear correctly in the compliance requirements lists:

- **4.1:** We create a compliance requirements list with **5 modules** (selected from the first row)*
- *The following 5 consecutive modules are selected the following month.
- **4.2:** We select "Yes" for all specifications
- **4.3:** We check that all entries appear on the product page
- **4.4:** We check that all entries appear on the PDF report

Templates

4.5: We create 1 **new document** (selected from the first row)* and download it in PDF format, for each country/market (US/EU/UK).

Note: We also create a new document when the **legislation version** and/or the **items** are updated as a result of a legislation update.

- **4.6:** We check the template page in the platform and the downloaded PDF documents to:
- a. Confirm that the headlines (template page and PDF) match the headlines stored in the template database and;
- b. The information in the template fields is present (template page and PDF).
- **4.7:** We reset and delete the document.



^{*}The following template is selected the following month.

Step 5: Source link monitoring

- **5.1:** All source links that can be found inside compliance requirements list entries/items and templates are available on a specific table of the Compliance Gate Platform database.
- **5.2:** A copy of the table is uploaded on a separate website.
- **5.3:** The links are scanned by a plugin titled Broken Link Checker. This plugin provides a list of:
 - 404: Broken URLs (page removed)
 - 301/302/307: Redirected URLs
- **5.4:** We take the following action in case any of the above is detected:
 - 404: We replace the source link
 - 301/302/307: We assess if the new page is relevant*

- **5.5:** There are some scenarios in which a missing, incorrect, or irrelevant source link could be present in the compliance requirements list entries or templates:
 - Plugin fails to detect 404/301/302/307
 - Content changed on page (but no 404/301/302/307)

There is also a risk of human error, resulting in missing, incorrect, or irrelevant source links not being replaced.



^{*}If yes, then we update to the current (redirected) source link. If not, then we replace the source link.
